**Profile:** Rick McCrary is the director of International Business Development for Boeing Military Aircraft, including the F/A-18E/F Super Hornet, F-15 Strike Eagle, and AH-64 Apache. Most recently he served as vice president of F/A-18 International Business Development for Boeing Defense, Space & Security (BDS) in Canberra, Australia, where he led the successful campaign to place Super Hornets in the Royal Australian Air Force.

McCrary has served in program management, strategic planning, business development and marketing positions for a variety of Boeing military programs. He served as field-marketing representative for U.S. Air Force programs with responsibility for F-15 and Joint Direct Attack Munition, and had two postings to Canberra for all BDS products.

McCrary joined Boeing following his retirement from the U.S. Air Force. During his 20-year career as a pilot, he accumulated more than 3,400 hours of flight time in high-performance aircraft including the SR-71. He held staff positions in requirements and acquisition for low

observable and reconnaissance systems at major command and in the Pentagon.

McCrary holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in philosophy from Georgia State University and a Master of Science degree in systems management from St. Mary's University.

**Synopsis:** The Lockheed SR-71 "Blackbird" is the fastest jet ever built, a machine so far ahead of its time even its own pilots thought it looked more like a spaceship than an airplane. It is an engineering marvel, powered by innovative engines that operated most efficiently at Mach 3.2, its typical cruising speed. From 1966 to 1998, it operated in secrecy, flown only by a



handful of the Air Force's most elite pilots. Rick McCrary was one of them. I got a phone call from a fella I flew T-38s with who asked if I was interested in "a new position." I was due to rotate, so I said sure. I was anticipating a desk job, which is just part of the rotation cycle as an Air Force officer. I can't say I was looking forward to it. He said that he'd been out with the SR-71 program, and that they were looking for a pilot. **Of course, that was an easy answer**".
