Jayne Hrdlicka was appointed Group Chief Executive Officer of Jetstar Airways Pty Limited on 1 July 2012 which is the Qantas Group's low fares airline brand. Headquartered in Melbourne, the Jetstar Group includes international and domestic operations in Australia and New Zealand. With its partners, the Jetstar Group also includes airlines in Singapore, Japan and Vietnam. In total, the Group flies to 85 destinations in 18 countries with a fleet of 129 aircraft. Jayne joined Qantas in August 2010 as Group Executive Strategy and Information Technology.

Jayne holds an MBA from Dartmouth College, New Hampshire USA and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Mathematics and Economics from the Colorado College, Colorado USA. In addition to her role at Jetstar, Jayne is a Board Director of Tennis Australia, a Member of the UN Women Private Sector Leadership Advisory Council, a Member of Chief Executive Women, and a Member of the Scotch College Council in Melbourne.

Born 9 February 1897 in Brisbane, Sir Charles Kingsford Smith was a renowned Australian aviator, known for being the first to complete a non-stop flight across the Australian main land and the first to complete a Trans-Pacific flight from the United States to Australia amongst his many achievements.
